Tourism Recovery Gradual Amid New Variants

- Tourism activity in the Asia & Pacific region remained sluggish in Q4 2021, due partly to the emergence of new COVID variants. Visitor arrivals were down by an estimated 93 percent in 2021Q4 from pre-pandemic levels (Figure 1). Renewed outbreaks amid new variants led to tightened international travel restrictions in 2021H2, particularly in the Pacific region (Figure 2). Travel regulations temporarily eased in 2021Q4 as cases from the Delta variant declined but concerns over Omicron variants kept tourism activities depressed. The number of inbound flights to the region has increased from last year but remains low (Figures 3 and 4).
- Asian tourism destinations. The Maldives' visitor arrivals have continued to grow since its border reopening in July 2020 and reached pre-pandemic levels in 2021Q4. Fiji reopened its borders to fully vaccinated travelers in December 2021, and tourism arrivals have begun to recover, down by 89 percent in 2021Q4 compared to pre-pandemic levels. Palau's tourism activities started to pick up in 2021Q3 helped by high vaccination rates and use of a travel bubble with Taiwan Province of China (this bubble was suspended in 2022Q1 due

to an outbreak of Omicron in Palau). **India** has seen its tourism numbers begin to recover gradually as the government eased international travel restrictions since October 2021. **Thailand** and **Indonesia** have started pilot programs for their popular beach destinations, including Phuket, Koh Samui, and Bali, which allow vaccinated international visitors to visit the islands with reduced quarantine requirements. As of February 1, 2022, **Thailand** further relaxed quarantine requirements for all destinations.

A gradual resumption of tourism activities is expected in the coming months as countries in Asia & Pacific plan to reopen their borders. The easing of travel restrictions is expected to regain momentum as more people in the region get vaccinated and Omicron waves subside. However, the path for recovery is still highly uncertain, especially for the countries currently struggling with surges in COVID-19 cases.


